Positive Discipline

Behaviour

The major changes made to the Positive Discipline system this term are proving to be effective and overall there has been a good response since it was implemented. A recent visit from HMI found that behaviour in and around the college has improved significantly.

Low level disruption in lessons has been reduced and more students are staying in lessons enabling learning to take place. Punctuality has improved and less students are late to college and lessons although **too many are returning late from lunch.**

We would like to thank parents/carers for their support in the implementation on the new system and hope that this will continue. A few issues still to be fully addressed are outlined below and we hope that these can be resolved as soon as possible.

Planners

There are a number of students who **'lose' or forget their planners** which means that they have no means of communicating information regarding detentions etc. to parents/carers. It also means that they cannot remember when they have detentions or if they have completed them or not. They also have no record of Homework or Merits received.

The planners are currently under review and in September they will be much improved but for the remainder of this year they will be the same and all students will receive a new planner after the half term break.

Non completion of Detentions

There are some students who **do not complete short detentions** therefore allowing them to escalate to longer ones after school which they then are also reluctant to complete and find themselves in Isolation.

Too many Detentions

There is also a small cohort of students who **are accumulating too many detentions** and therefore finding it very difficult to complete them all.

We would ask that parents/carers continue to support the college and their children by;-

- **Checking that they have planners with them every day**
- **Check the planners for information and sign them daily/weekly**
- **Ensure that their children complete Detentions as soon as they get them**
- **Ensure that their children get back into college by 1.25pm after lunch**

Uniform Update

Overall the students have responded well to issues regarding uniform and generally the students arrive to college wearing the correct clothing and foot wear.

Following the article in the previous newsletter we have decided to make some quite radical changes to the uniform from September 2010 and are changing to a more traditional uniform. We are still keeping two sweatshirt colours to identify lower (grey) and upper (black) school students but they will be **'V' necked** and not round neck as now.

From September the uniform will be as follows:-

Lower school (Yrs 7 and 8)

- **Grey** 'v' necked sweat shirt (no other jumpers or cardigans will be allowed)
- White shirt or Blouse
- Andrew Marvell tie
- Black school trousers (no leggings, 'jeggings', jeans or cut offs allowed) or skirt (of an appropriate length)
- Plain Black shoes

(Please Note that from September Training type shoes, sandshoe type shoes and Boots will no longer be allowed)

Upper School (Yrs 7, 8 and 9)

- **Black** 'v' necked sweat shirt (no other jumpers or cardigans will be allowed)
- White shirt or Blouse
- Andrew Marvell tie
- Black school trousers (no leggings, jeggings, jeans or cut offs allowed) or skirt (of an appropriate length)
- Plain Black shoes

(Please Note that from September Training type shoes, Sand shoe type shoes and Boots will no longer be allowed)

Ties and 'v' neck sweat shirts will be available from the college and can be purchased from reception.

Until September the current uniform will stay the same and students not adhering to the policy will be dealt with as per the Discipline System. Please also remember that no form of **headwear** is allowed on the college site.

Jewellery

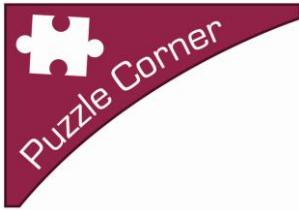
We are still a non jewellery college and students **should not wear jewellery at all**. Too many students remove jewellery when asked but then replace it. All jewellery **should be left at home**.

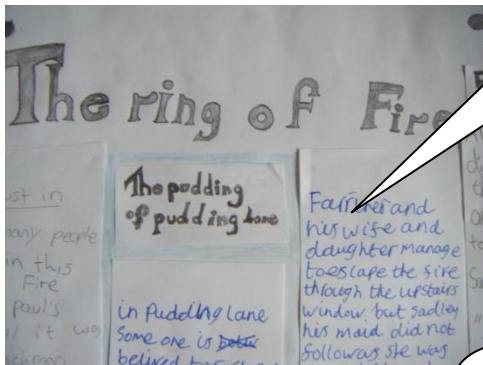

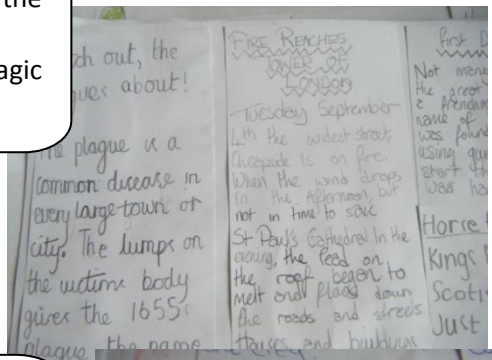
