Examination results at Andrew Marvell for the Class of 2010 have hit an all time high.

GCSE grades for the Class of 2010 show that results have soared with:

- **78%** (69% in 2009) of students gaining 5 or more A* - C grades.
- **48%** (43% in 2009) gaining the Gold Standard 5 or more A* - C grades including English and Mathematics.



These record breaking results for Andrew Marvell place us solidly in the top 5 of city schools for GCSE Gold Standard results.

1st Trinity 87%, 2nd Malet Lambert 61%, 3rd St Marys College 60%, 4th Kelvin Hall 51%
5th Andrew Marvell 48%

These are the highest ever results achieved by Andrew Marvell. The results for 2010 show:

- **98%** of all students gaining at least 1 GCSE grade A*-G.
- **48%** of all students gaining the Gold Standard 5 or more A*-C grades including English and Mathematics against a target of 38% for this year
- **41%** of boys gaining the Gold Standard 5 or more A*-C grades including English and Mathematics and narrowing the gap on girls with 54% this year.

Our ambitious target for the Class of 2011 is to break the 50% mark for gold standard results and further close the gap on the other top 4 performing schools.

The trend since 2007 has seen Andrew Marvell's A*-C continue to improve.

- In 2007 53% of students gained 5 or more A*-C but these results have rocketed up to **78%** gaining 5 or more of these highest grades in 2010.
- In 2007 33% of students gained 5 or more A*-C grades including English and Mathematics but these results have increased up to **48%** gaining 5 or more of these highest grades in 2010.
- The performance gap for these Gold Standard results have narrowed between boys and girls with boys exceeding their target grades.

UPDATE SEPT 2010

Andrew Marvell Business and Enterprise Specialist College is a Foundation Trust school sponsored by the Co-operative.

The school is to be a new build on the existing school site with all students remaining on site and accommodated safely, using additional temporary buildings, whilst the new build is taking place. The new school will have an increased capacity for 1,300 students plus an additional space to enhance the 14-19 learning opportunity. The new school is due to open in September 2012.

Construction on the site will commence in the new year and the school will be clearly separated from the construction site by the use of a temporary high wooden fence (hoarding.) The school staff and students will have access to the Barham, Jervis and Norland buildings to support the curriculum.

The school currently has significant levels of community use and the new building will promote this further. It has been designed to actively encourage wider participation and community use through theatre space, drama and dance studios, fitness suites, sports hall and a floodlit all weather pitch. Additional community facilities will include a community library, customer service centre, space for family centred services and business conference zone.

Jack Waller:

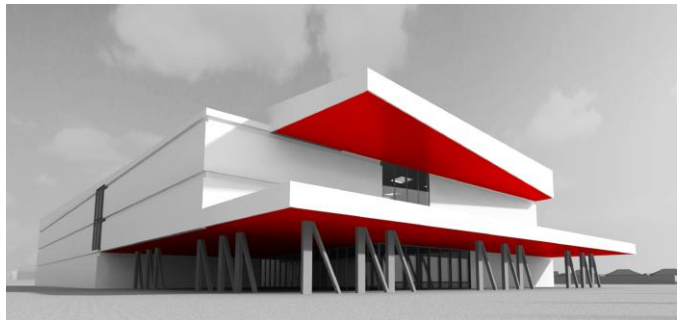
